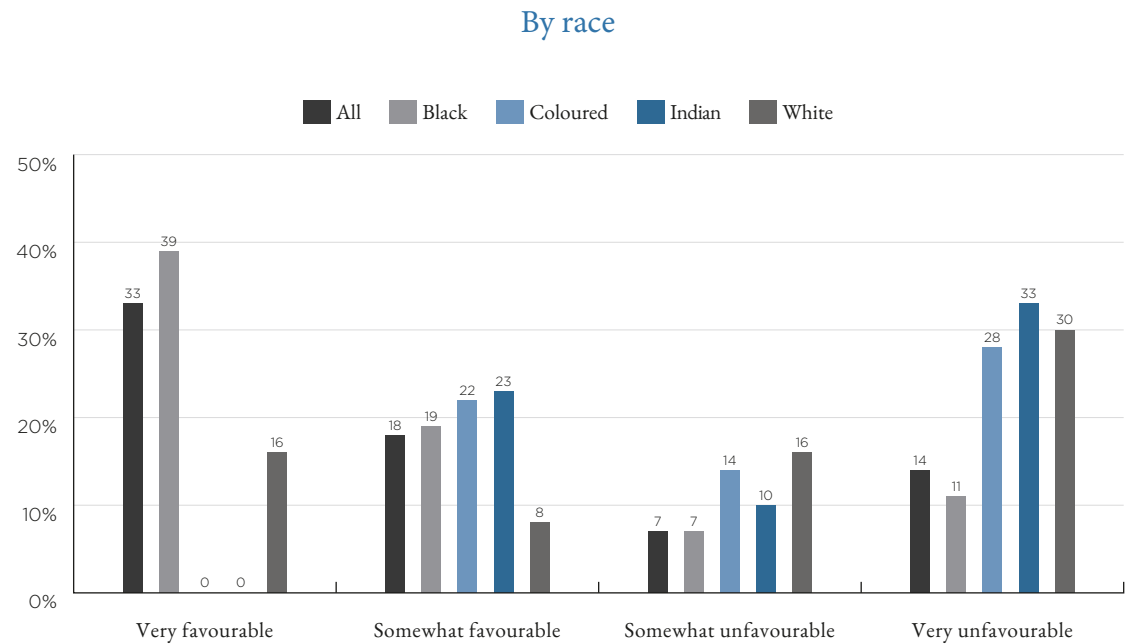


PERCEPTIONS OF KWAZULU-NATAL REGISTERED VOTERS TOWARDS THE INGONYAMA TRUST

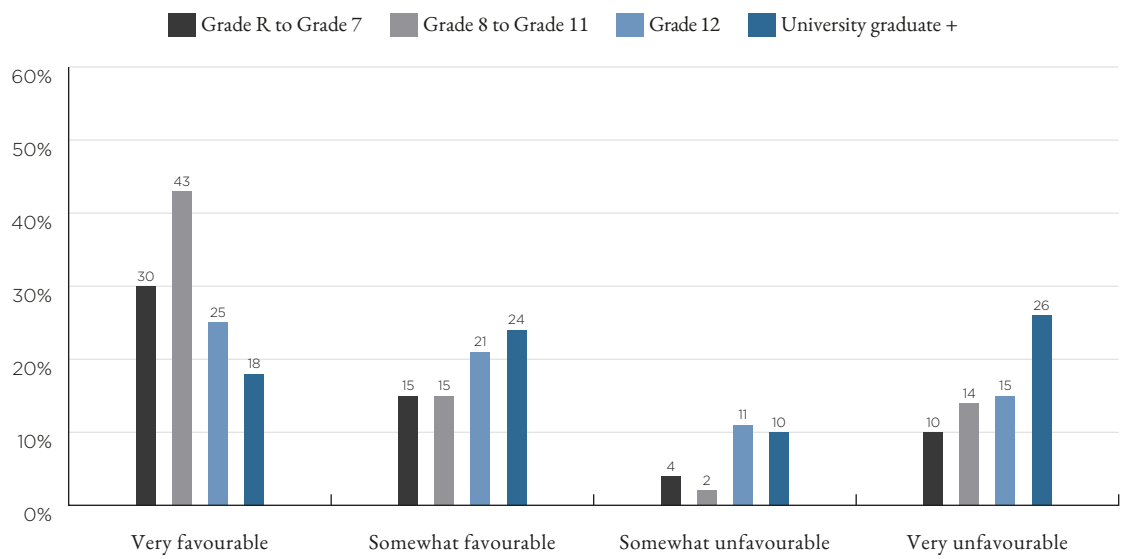
This report examines the perceptions of registered voters in KwaZulu-Natal towards the Ingonyama Trust.

The data in the report comes from a September 2023 Foundation survey. The survey was conducted telephonically amongst a sample of 2 434 geographically and demographically representative registered voters in KwaZulu-Natal. The survey has a provincial margin of error of 3%. Totals may not add up to 100% where respondents refused to answer a question or where rounding has occurred.

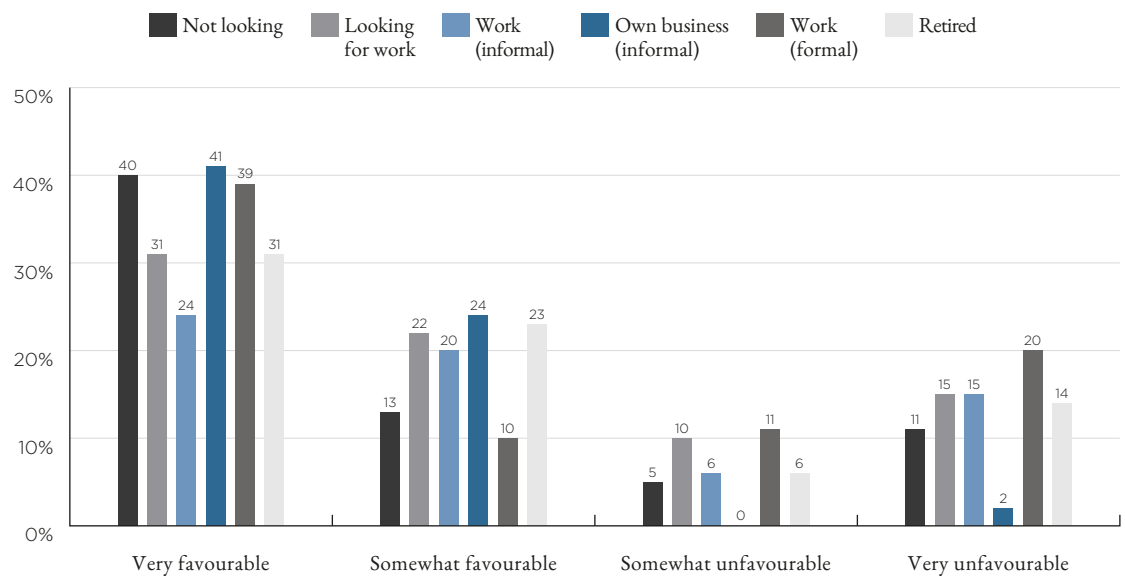
HOW FAVOURABLE ARE YOU TOWARD THE INGONYAMA TRUST?



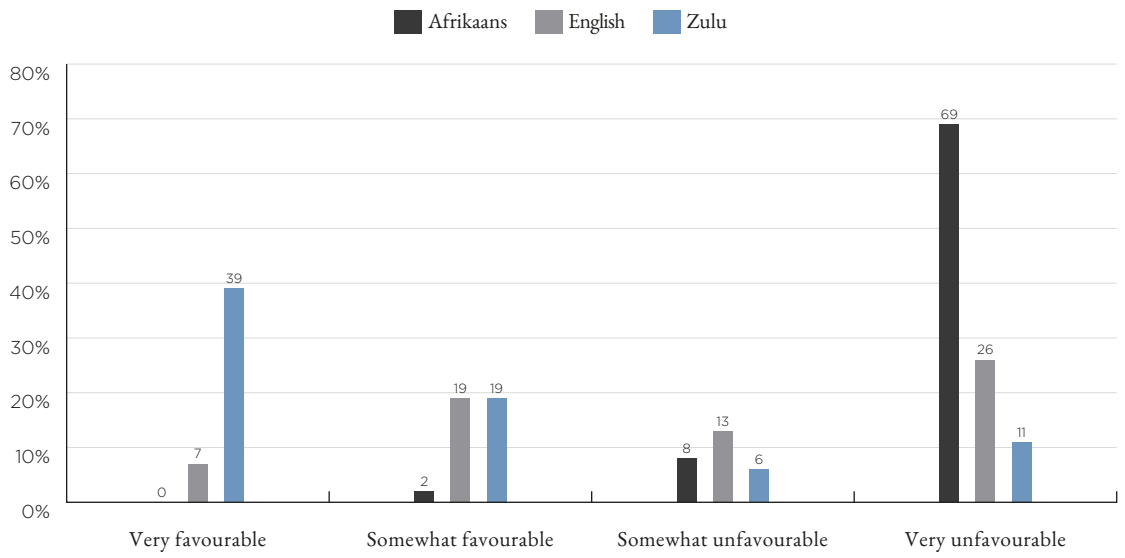
By highest level of education



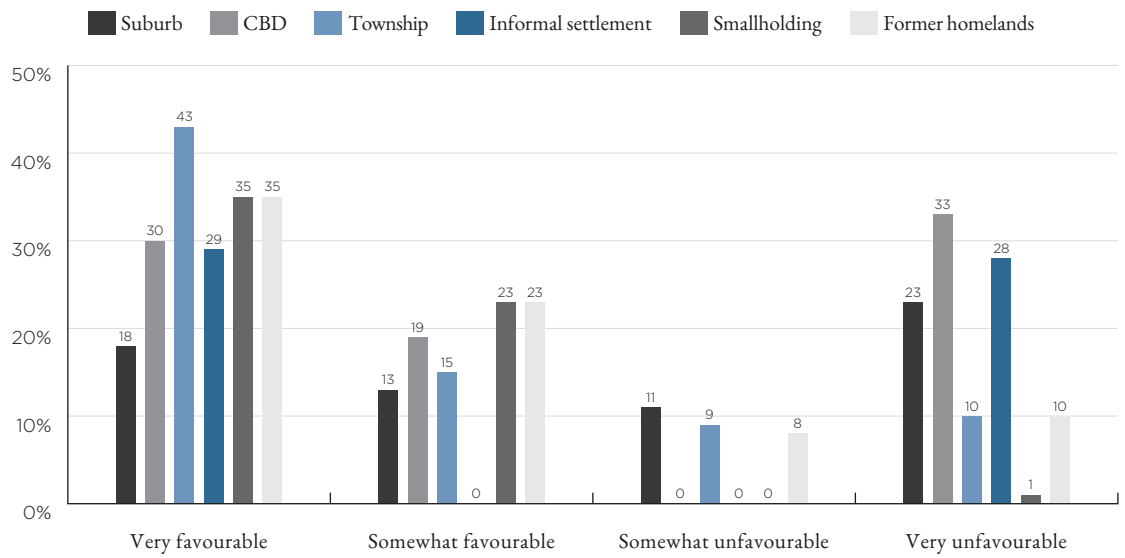
By employment status



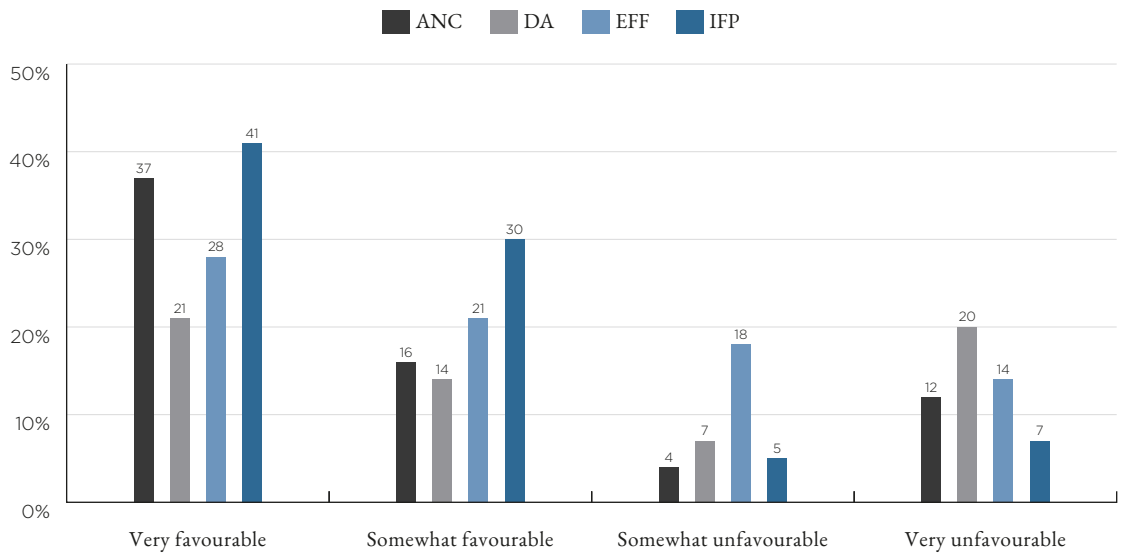
By home language

TENTATIVE CONCLUSIONS

More than half of the registered voters in KwaZulu-Natal were favourable towards the Ingonyama Trust. However, when broken down by home language, a majority of Afrikaans and English speakers felt unfavourable towards the Trust, as opposed to Xhosa and Zulu speakers where a majority felt favourable towards it. Across lines of party affiliation 71% of IFP voters 53% of ANC voters, 49% of EFF and 35% of DA voters felt favourably towards the Ingonyama trust.
